Large cable companies have been subsumed by others, the BCA has moved with the times and quite literally from its London offices to a virtual office with all staff members working from home.

Peter Smeeth said: "Despite the changes in our method of operating, the BCA has maintained its position as the cable experts in the electrical supply chain and steadily increased its membership.

"I have thoroughly enjoyed my tenure in the cable industry, making many friends in the BCA and outside in the wider industry. I leave a thoroughly professional, dedicated staff and will miss working with them and our consultants Acumen Communications. The camaraderie of all the cable makers has been exceptional and I wish them all the very best in the future," he continued.

Peter plans to resume his hobbies of drawing, painting, writing poetry, keeping fit and spending as much time as possible on his beloved `Balconia'. He has a number of grandchildren vying for drawings, an education in outdoor pursuits and understanding the natural world. He knows he will be kept busy.
